Play **Hiding Bears Game**:

Find 10 of some kind of small counter or object. We use bears in class.

Put all 10 counters on the table. 1 person closes their eyes and the other hides some counters.

The person with their eyes closed opens and looks at the counters left. Look at how many are left to figure out how many counters the other person hid. (Know that there were 10 to start) Then switch roles!!
